





< fold fabric in equal halves, wrong side out.



← lay pattern on fabric with shoulders lined up to the fold. Trace lightly with pencil.

3) Cut out gown shape. For a slightly bigger gown give a 14 seam allowance all the way around the sleeves + sides.



stitch up sides (I like to do French seams if the fabric is very light, like silk or lawn)

(5) Cut up center of back from hem to neck. Turn Right side out.



(6) Finishing: finish back opening edges with double fold, trimnick line with double fold or ribbon with some lace stitched on, leaving extra at back for ties. hem and trim sleeves and hem line.



Notes:

Sometimes I add plackets to the back so there is overlap.

A pinifore front or extra layer is good if a fabric is sheer. I just do it, without a pattern, and use little pintucks.
